

South Lanarkshire Licensing Board
Annual Functions Report

In accordance with Section 9A Licensing (Scotland) Act 2005

1 April 2019 to 31 March 2020

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1. Introduction – South Lanarkshire Licensing Board

- 1.1 South Lanarkshire Licensing Board is divided into four Licensing Divisions. Each licensing division is a separate legal entity. The Board comprises of the following divisions:-
- South Lanarkshire Licensing Division No.1 (Clydesdale Area)
 - South Lanarkshire Licensing Division No. 2 (East Kilbride Area)
 - South Lanarkshire Licensing Division No. 3 (Hamilton Area)
 - South Lanarkshire Licensing Division No. 4 (Rutherglen and Cambuslang Area)
- 1.2 The Licensing (Scotland) Act 2005 as amended (“the Act”) makes provision for regulating the sale of alcohol and for regulating licensed premises and other premises on which alcohol is sold.
- 1.3 The Licensing Board is the Licensing Authority for the purposes of the Licensing (Scotland) Act 2005 and is responsible for considering:-
- premises licences (including provisional licences)
 - occasional licences
 - temporary licences
 - transfer of premises licences
 - variation of premises licences
 - extensions of licensing hours
 - personal licences

2. Licensing Objectives

- 2.1 The Act sets out the following five licensing objectives (“the licensing objectives”):-
- preventing crime and disorder
 - securing public safety
 - preventing public nuisance
 - protecting and improving public health
 - protecting children and young persons from harm
- 2.2 The licensing objectives provide a basis for the administration of the licensing regime. They also provide potential reasons for refusal of an application for the grant or variation of a premises licence or an occasional licence. Breach of the objectives may provide grounds for reviewing a premises licence. Conditions attached to a premises licence or an occasional licence may be based on any one or more of the licensing objectives.
- 2.3 In exercising its functions under the Act, the Board are required to have regard to the licensing objectives.

3. Annual Functions Report

- 3.1 In the year from 1 April 2019 to 31 March 2020 the four Licensing Divisions met a total of 19 times. This was broken down as follows:-

South Lanarkshire Licensing Division No.1 (Clydesdale Area) - 3 times

South Lanarkshire Licensing Division No. 2 (East Kilbride Area) – 5 times

South Lanarkshire Licensing Division No. 3 (Hamilton Area) – 6 times

South Lanarkshire Licensing Division No. 4 (Rutherglen and Cambuslang Area) - 5 times

- 3.2 Applications before the Board were dealt with in an open and transparent manner in accordance with licensing legislation and its five year statement of licensing policy 2018-2023. A copy of each Licensing Division’s policy is shown at the following links:-

In terms of the above policies the following matters require to be dealt with at a Licensing Board meeting:-

- Premises licence applications
- Major variations of premises licences
- Reviews of premises licences and personal licences
- Personal licence where the applicant has been convicted of a relevant offence and there is a recommendation for refusal from Police Scotland or a report from Police Scotland concerning the applicant's fitness to be the holder of a personal licence.

In addition where premises have operated an occasional licence for three consecutive months or more this would now require to be dealt with by the Licensing Board.

- 3.3 Information and assistance was made available to persons wishing to apply for a licence, make representations or lodge objections. For detailed legal advice applicants were referred to their own Solicitors to obtain independent legal advice.
- 3.4 The Board is aware of the need to ensure that the licensing process is accessible to all. Assistance is therefore always available on request for those who require special arrangements to access any part of the process.
- 3.5 At its meetings, each division attempts to make the process as easy to follow as possible and consistent with the carrying out of the Board's quasi-judicial function.
- 3.6 The Board always attempts to follow best practice in enforcement as detailed in the [enforcement concordat](#) including adoption of standards which, will in its actions, be proportionate, accountable, consistent, transparent and targeted.

4. Decisions of the Board

- 4.1 Each application for new premises licences or variations of licence (other than a minor variation), was decided on its own merits. All applications were dealt with as shown at Appendix 1. A number of decisions were contrary to Part 4 of the statement of licensing policy, on over provision, which holds that there is a rebuttable presumption against the grant of an application for a new premises licence or major variation within those parts of the Board's area determined as being overprovided. Applications granted in areas deemed to be overprovided were as follows:-

East Kilbride Division

Jaro Design Limited, 33 Common Green, Strathaven (provisional premises licence)

Heron Farm Shop and Kitchen, Kindrochet, Strathaven (premises licence)

Hamilton Division

San Vincenzo, 29 Main Street, Bothwell (provisional premises licence)

- 4.2 During the course of the year, each division received applications for both Occasional Licences and Extended Hours. Each division issued the following number of licences.

Extended Hours:-

- South Lanarkshire Licensing Division No. 1 (Clydesdale Area) 2
- South Lanarkshire Licensing Division No. 2 (East Kilbride Area) 19
- South Lanarkshire Licensing Division No. 3 (Hamilton Area) 25
- South Lanarkshire Licensing Division No. 4 (Rutherglen and Cambuslang Area) 24

The majority of occasional licences were received timeously (at least 28 days before the event). However where this is not the case a reason for lateness is requested and the matter referred to the Convener of the appropriate Division to decide whether despite the late lodging there is sufficient time to process the application. Where an application for extended hours is received outwith policy the Convener will decide as to whether or not the application will be dealt with by way of written submissions or by way of a hearing before the Board.

- 4.3 In assessing applications, the Board used a considerable number of different sources of information to enable them to reach determinations. These sources included representation from Community Councils, Local Residents, the Licensing Standards Officer and Police Scotland. No objections were received from the National Health Service.
- 4.4 Objections were received to a number of applications for new premises licences or variations (other than minor variations). These are shown on Appendix 1. These mainly comprised concerns over proposed outdoor areas, perceived potential noise problems from increased hours, playing of live music or entertainment, possible disturbance from increased numbers of persons arriving and leaving in cars, possible disturbance caused by youths congregating at nearby licensed premises/potential new premises, noise at dispersal times and nuisance from smokers. All competent objections were taken into account in the decision making process.
- 4.5 The number of current premises licences within South Lanarkshire is 705. Details of current premises licences held in each division are shown in the [register](#).
- 4.6 In the course of Licensing Board business a number of applications for Personal Licences were also heard and determined by the appropriate Division. The following number of personal licences were issued by each Division:-
- South Lanarkshire Licensing Division No. 1 (Clydesdale Area) 151
 - South Lanarkshire Licensing Division No. 2 (East Kilbride Area) 149
 - South Lanarkshire Licensing Division No. 3 (Hamilton Area) 261
 - South Lanarkshire Licensing Division No. 4 (Rutherglen and Cambuslang Area) 112

Appendix 2 details the Personal Licences dealt with by each of the Licensing Divisions at a Board meeting as opposed to by use of delegated powers.

- 4.7 The number of current personal licences issued by South Lanarkshire is 2305.

5. Licensing Board Member's Training

Each Licensing Division comprises of 10 members. All Licensing Board Members have passed an examination following mandatory training in licensing legislation and Board functions. The Board recognises the need for all members to have an up to date knowledge and understanding of licensing law and practice. All members of staff who clerk the Licensing Boards attend training courses and networking groups. Staff preparing the Board undergo in-house training on a frequent basis.

6. Licensed Hours

- 6.1 In granting licences while the Board recognises that licensing hours are important to individual licensed premises, such hours can have a wider impact for an area. Balanced against this, the board does not wish to unnecessarily inhibit the development of thriving and

safe evening and night time local economies which are important for investment, employment and tourism. The Board considers that the on sale and off sale hours detailed in each Licensing Division's policy are appropriate for each Divisional area and represent a balance between the interests of the public, residents, licensed businesses and patrons of licensed premises.

- 6.2 In terms of the Act, the sale of alcohol for consumption off the premises is not permitted before 10.00am and after 10.00pm. The policy of each Licensing Division is that the maximum available licensed hours of 10.00am to 10.00pm each day are generally appropriate for off sales. However, each off sales application will be assessed on its own merits against these licensed hours and the Board will wish to ensure that the licensing objectives are being promoted in such applications.
- 6.3 Each application for a premises licence is assessed on its own merits against the on sale policy hours of the appropriate Division as per the type of activity for which a licence is being sought. Where an application received is requesting licensed hours outwith policy, the appropriate Division will require further information for the consideration of such applications to convince the Division to deviate from its policy and the Board will take into account the effect of granting such a licence will have on the area.
- 6.4 The Board has an existing practice of permitting longer licensed hours over the Christmas/New Year festive period. Each Division makes a Section 67 direction if it decides to adopt the usual practice of extending hours over the festive period advertised on the Council's website.
- 6.5 In 2019, as in previous years, each Division approved a festive policy as per Appendix 3 from Sunday, 1 December 2019 to Thursday, 2 January 2020. No application or intimation of the intention to use this facility was required and licensees simply used the additional hours as required. As in previous years, no complaints were received in relation to the operation of any premises use of these extended hours.

7. Site Visits by the Licensing Board

During the period 1 April 2019 to 31 March 2020 the following evening site visits took place.

East Kilbride – 1 visit carried out with 7 licensed premises being visited

8. Opt In List

Each of the Divisions has created what is called an opt-in list. This enables people to find out what licensing applications have been lodged in their area. This list is purely for information. 10. Reviews

- 10.1 In the period 1 April 2019 to 31 March 2020 there were 17 premises licence reviews brought before the Board. These were for non-payment of annual fees including premises which ceased to have effect and applications for review received from Police Scotland and the Licensing Standard Officer. 9 premises licences were revoked.
- 10.2 In the same period the Board heard 3 personal licence reviews which resulted in 1 personal licence being revoked.

11. Licensing Standards Officer

South Lanarkshire Licensing Board currently has three Licensing Standards Officers.

Mark Clinton and Gerry Margiotti cover Licensing Divisions No. 1 and No. 3 (Clydesdale Division and Hamilton Division).

Frank Carroll and Gerry Margiotti cover Licensing Division No. 2 and No. 4 (East Kilbride Division and Rutherglen and Cambuslang Division).

The Licensing Standards Officers carry out the following functions:-

- provide information and guidance relating to the legislation in South Lanarkshire;
- supervise the compliance of licence holders with the conditions of their licences and other requirements of licensing legislation providing mediation services for the purpose of avoiding or resolving disputes or disagreements between the licence holders and any other persons (e.g. neighbouring proprietors).

In addition to the licensing functions, the Licensing Standards Officers also have Civic (Government) Scotland Act 1982 responsibilities and will undertake duties in relation to Landlord Registration enforcement.

12. Conclusion

The Board is pleased to report that generally licensed premises in each of the four Divisions have been well run and generally problem free in the last year. In this respect the Board congratulates and thanks the licensed trade in its efforts in promoting and upholding the licensing objectives and complying with each of the Licensing Division's policy.
